## **Emergency Communications Priorities:**

- 1. Normal Phone
- 2. Cell Phone (including texting)
- Email
- 4. FRS Radio. Primary Channel: 13 (467.6875 MHz)
- 5. Amateur Radio (FCC Licensed) using Draper repeater at 447.100 MHz (-) PL tone 100 Hz or simplex 146.48 MHz
- 6. Runner (Two runners if possible)

This publication is intended to be kept as simple as possible and to give neighborhood residents some initial guidance on how to prepare for and respond to emergencies that may affect a wide area of the community / neighborhood. It is not all inclusive, merely a starting point.

Designated leaders, volunteers, and professionals will work with information gathered to decide the appropriate courses of action.

Additional helpful/training information will be regularly distributed by Block Captains.

## Family Emergency Plan - Pre-Planning

Your family may not be together when a disaster strikes, so it is important to plan in advance.

- 1. Identify an out of town/state contact and let them know you have selected them to be in your emergency contact point. If you have a cell phone, program that person(s) s ICE (In Case of Emergency) in your phone. Be sure every member of your family knows the phone number of the emergency contact and has a cell phone, coins, or a prepaid phone card. Fill out the Emergency Contact and Resources Survey and return to your block captain or EP committee member with a minimum ICE contact information. Copies will be kept at CPs for emergency use only.
- 2. Teach family members how to use text messaging (also known as SMS or Short Message Service). Text messaging can often get around network disruptions when a phone call may not be able to get through.
- 3. Teach family members two alternative routes to evacuate from each room in your house in case of emergency such as fire. Agree where family members will gather/meet (a location outside the house, primary; and a neighborhood location if the home is not safe, secondary). Practice your escapes and gathering.
- 4. Teach responsible family members where and how to shut off utilities (gas, water, electricity), and how to use a fire extinguisher. Have the tools to do this in a safe and easy place to get to.
- 5. Teach family members how to perform first aid.
- 6. Recommended: 72-hour kit, a 3-month food supply, a 3-month water supply (1 gallon per person per day).
- 7. Teach family members how to use radios and TVs for emergency messaging.
